THE FUTURE OF YOUR FISHING RIGHTS IN THE NORTHWESTERN HAWAIIAN ISLANDS

Attention Fishermen, Native Hawaiians and Other Interested Individuals

The federal government is looking to establish a **National Marine Sanctuary in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands (NWHI)**. The Sanctuary office has identified a fishing management regime that would **prohibit or restrict** ...

- All fishing for coral reef fish species throughout the NWHI
- Recreational and commercial fishing in 88 percent of the shallow water
- Recreational and commercial fishing in 53 percent of the waters to 100 fms
- Native Hawaiian subsistence use

The Western Pacific Fishery Management Council will be seeking public comment on the draft fishing regulations for the proposed Sanctuary. Discussion will focus on the future of recreational and commercial fisheries (bottomfish, lobster, pelagic, coral reef and precious corals). Protected species and Native Hawaiian and subsistence fishing will also be addressed. The meetings will be held from **6 to 9 p.m.** at the following locations:
