

NO BOTTOMFISH FISHING

May 1 - September 30, 2007

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) and the State of Hawaii will be closing the waters of the Main Hawaiian Islands to fishing for onaga, ehū, gindai, opakapaka, kalekale, lehi and hapuupuu (Deep-7 bottomfish species) from May 1 to September 30 of this year as a result of overfishing of bottomfish in the Main Hawaiian Islands. Additional regulations are also being developed to protect Hawaii's bottomfish resources and fishermen. The Western Pacific Regional Fishery Management Council along with the NMFS and State of Hawaii will be holding public meetings to discuss these new regulations (see place and times below).
