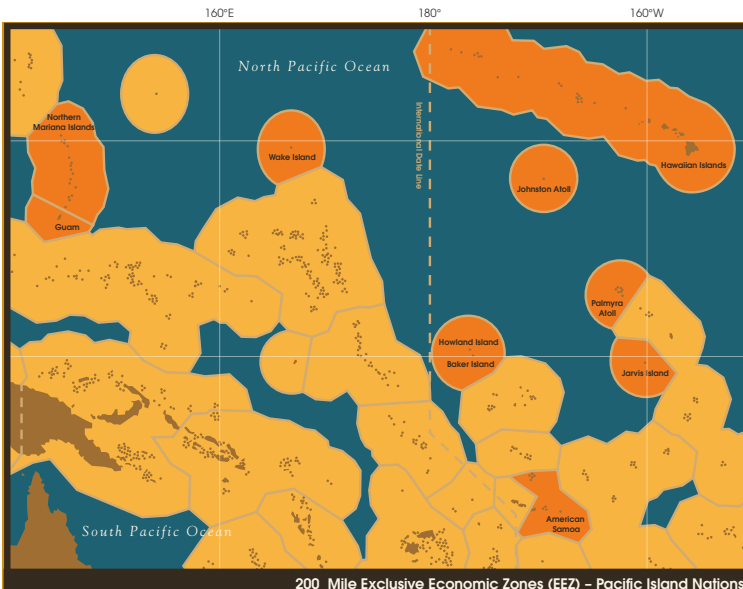

THE MAGNUSON-STEVENS FISHERY CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT ACT

is the primary law governing fishery management in federal waters (3 to 200 miles offshore). It requires the Council to

- **PREPARE**, monitor and amend management plans for offshore fisheries
- **SPECIFY** annual catch limits
- **DEVELOP** other conservation and management measures (e.g., gear/season/area restrictions)
- **CREATE** reports on annual fishery performance
- **DEVELOP** multi-year research priorities
- **DESCRIBE** and identify essential fish habitat
- **COOPERATE** internationally to manage highly migratory species
