A license agreement with Hui Malama 'O Mo'omomi for the stewardship of a Recreational and Cultural Park

### GUIDELINES

- Use of pavilion or camping permit can be obtained from DHHL, Moloka'i District Office.
- A use permit is eligible to Moloka'i Homesteaders family and guests, Native Hawaiians on Moloka'i waiting list or organizations for educational purposes.
- All permittees are responsible for the safety and welfare of family members and guests.
- Keep all areas clean, this includes beach and facilities.
- Permittees and guests shall not gather or harvest ocean resources by access from Park during closed season. [mo'i, mullet, lobster etc.]
- We encourage your support; for the protection of our lobster population, please gather with no more than [3] pieces of lobster net.
- All individuals entering the Park shall ensure the protection of native plants, historical sites, and habitat's.

### THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES ARE PROHIBITED:

Licering, use of pavilion or camping more than [5] consecutive days are arms and hunting, abandoned cars, use of illega substance, residential and commercial use.
