Human uses of Guam's coastline, reefs, and near-shore waters are expanding at a rate that challenges our ability to plan and manage them. To sustain our fishing communities and avoid potential use conflicts, it is critical that we understand the geographic patterns of various near-shore fishing efforts, and how these relate to key habitat for priority species, as well as possible threats to fishing access.
