AN ACT

Mandating the Division of Customs to conduct K-9 unit drug detections for all inter-island commuter flight entries and seaport entries in the effort to combat drugs within the Commonwealth by amending 6 CMC § 2304 to add a new subsection (d); and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE NINETEENTH NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

Section 1. Findings and Purpose. The Commonwealth Legislature finds that the prevalence of drugs, especially methamphetamines "ice", in the Commonwealth has greatly increased. The Commonwealth Legislature finds that drugs continue to harm communities and destroy families. With the efforts to combat drugs through the CNMI's "War on Ice", the Department of Public Safety (DPS) has greatly increased and prioritized its enforcement strategies to crack down on drugs such as ice. However, the Commonwealth Legislature finds that DPS cannot fight this war alone. The Commonwealth Legislature believes that all enforcement agencies must come together in collaboration to truly make an impact in the effort to eradicate drugs in the CNMI; this includes fighting drugs in our borders.

The Commonwealth Legislature finds that an effective strategy to tackle drugs at the port of entries is to also conduct drug detections with the use of K-9 units of interisland travelers. Currently, the Division of Customs enforces our borders through the use of K-9 units solely in Saipan. The Commonwealth Legislature finds that increased efforts should include drug detection through the use of K-9s at the port of entries in Rota and

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14 15 Tinian. The use of K-9 units to conduct drug detection in Rota and Tinian would-deter the smuggling of drugs using inter-island commuter routes.

The Commonwealth Legislature believes that the ice epidemic is not just a problem occurring in Saipan but also greatly affecting the communities in Tinian and Rota. The Commonwealth Legislature further finds that in order to deter the smuggling of drugs into our borders, it is necessary to conduct drug detection screenings through the use of K-9s at all points of entries in the Commonwealth. The purpose of this legislation is to require the Division of Customs to conduct K-9 unit drug detections for all inter-island commuter flight entries and seaport entries in the effort to combat drugs within the Commonwealth.

Section 2. <u>Amendment</u>. 6 CMC § 2304 is hereby amended by adding a new subsection (d) to read as follows:

"(d) The Division of Customs shall extend K-9 unit screenings for the purpose of detecting illegal drugs and other contrabands at all seaports and airports within the Commonwealth including all inter-island outgoing and incoming commuter flights as well as incoming and outgoing water crafts."

Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

Section 4. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence at the date this Act becomes effective.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
