


THE MAGNUSON-STEVENS FISHERY CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT ACT

is the primary law governing fishery management in federal waters (3 to 200 miles offshore). It requires the Council to

- PREPARE, monitor and amend management plans for offshore fisheries
- SPECIFY annual catch limits
- DEVELOP other conservation and management measures (e.g., gear/season/area restrictions)
- CREATE reports on annual fishery performance
- DEVELOP multi-year research priorities
- DESCRIBE and identify essential fish habitat
- COOPERATE internationally to manage highly migratory species
