Recap of April 2025 Consultation

Community Observations Heard:

- Harbor access and slip availability remain major challenges for small fishers
- Rising costs and unclear licensing rules make it difficult to stay commercial
- Younger generation disconnected from traditional fishing knowledge
- Frustration with management processes that limit local decision-making
- Interest in reopening the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands (NWHI) fishery
- Shared desire to balance conservation with community food security and culture

Key Themes Identified:

- Importance of sustaining local seafood and cultural practices
- Equity in fisheries access and management
- Strengthening community participation in decision-making
- Expanding opportunities for next-generation fishers
