Recap of April 2025 Consultation

Community Observations Heard:

- Military still bombing Ka'ula Rock impacts to fish and birds noted
- Homelessness, drugs, and access loss making fishing unsafe
- Too many turtles interest in a cultural take system
- Shark and monk seal populations increasing; monk seals taking shibi
- Regulations not adaptive every moku faces different challenges
- More fish offshore, fewer nearshore fewer fishers remaining active
- "Instagram fishing" changing motivations and market dynamics
- Loss of local buyers: dependence on Costco and bulk supply chains
- Interest in reopening the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands (NWHI) bottomfish fishery

Key Themes Identified:

- Rising cost of fishing keeping youth out of the trade
- Loss of traditional foodways and cultural practices
- Frustration over non-local funding and decision-making in Holomua
- Need for more local FADs and nearshore fishing opportunities
- Importance of defining "commercial fisher" and regulating online fish sales
