Recap of April 2025 Consultation – Molokai

Community Observations Heard:

- Shark numbers increasing; heavy depredation on paka and onaga grounds
- Mixed views on sharks as aumākua vs. impacts to livelihood
- Concern about growing monk seal population reducing local fish
- Desire for balance in predator management such as sharks, seals, and humans
- Ta'ape identified as major problem; calls to open targeted fishery and remove taxes
- Community-based management respect for ahupua'a boundaries & catch sharing
- Frustration that research is conducted on Molokai without returning benefits or funding
- Concern about outside fishers and commercial activity taking local resources
- Recognition that land issues (deer, mangroves, runoff) directly affect ocean health
- Strong interest in restoration projects including limu gardens and youth involvement
- Hope to preserve Molokai's resources before large-scale development occurs
